You Don't Know for 20 Years Feedback

WOW! Thank you so much for this! I really enjoyed reading what you did to encourage your sons. What really strikes me is how you made no value judgments on the things they found interesting – like becoming interested in comic books although you didn't like them when you were younger. It is such a validating thing to do for them – it validates their choices, and helps them know that even though they may like unusual things, that this is okay, and beyond okay, it is worthwhile.

What struck me most of all was how similar many of these things are to what my parents did for me and my brother. My parents (all three -mom, grandmother, and grandfather) probably ran more on instinct than knowledge, as mom was a secretary, and neither of my grandparents finished high school, and I'm sure it wouldn't have even occurred them to research "current thinking" on how to raise creative children. But, even on our modest means growing up, my parents offered us as much opportunity as they could. We saw musicals and I got to go look into the orchestra pit at intermission, and we went to see plays. Mom even took got us pit crew passes at a car race. We got to experiment, and if ballet didn't work, I didn't have to stick it out, I could guit if it was obvious is wasn't for me. When I was a little older, my mom knew a friend of a friend who was in a country and western band and she arranged for me to hang out "backstage" at this very grown-up party and watch this drummer lady play. I had been playing drums all of 9 months and had never seen a big drum set up close. When I was in my first band, grandparents let the three older boys that I was in my first band with come and rehearse in our living room all those keyboards and amps and guitars in the midst of my

grandmother's French provincial furniture. They'd peek in the door and tap their feet to "Smoke on the Water." How cool is that! And I wanted to go to band camp, but it cost a hundred dollars – which was way too much money at the time, but my grandfather helped me paint a lady's garage as soon as school let out, so that I could earn the money I needed so that I could go. My grandfather brought my drum set to school every single day, and learned how to set it up so that it would be all ready to go in time for 6th period jazz band because there was no place safe to lock it up overnight, and I couldn't afford two drum sets. Talk about support! Equal but different things were also done for my brother to support his interests. They generally let us fight our own battles at school, but when it came to matters of self-esteem, (what they might have labeled as "persecution" back then) that's when they took action – and often they didn't tell us what they were doing on our behalf, so as not to "embarrass" us. I found out about some of what they did many years later.

All too often we blame our parents for what they do to scar us for life, but this is something I'm absolutely positive that my folks got exactly right, and my mom still gets it right because she continues it to this day.

Thanks so much for sharing this! It really was validating for me! I feel happy just thinking about it, and I have this comforting sense that "this sure explains a lot" about how I turned out the way I did. I suppose it could have really turned out completely differently, if I had been assigned to a slightly different set of parents.
